| FOLD Ireland | Dublin | A pollination garden project in Dublin for older persons and persons with dementia. Residents will plant wildflowers and herbs. Funding will also support the provision of recycled plastic chairs and a picnic table so residents can watch the pollination activity. |
| Dun Laoghaire Rathdown County Council | Dublin | Construction of a safe play area in front of Nutgrove Crescent, a Traveller specific grouped housing scheme in Dublin. The funding will cover the provision of an all-weather soft surface area and artificial grass, weatherproof fencing, benches, a sand pit for children to play and shrubs to add greenery to the area. |
| Clanmil Housing Association | Kildare | The enhancement of green areas in the Slí an Chanail housing estate in Leixlip, Co Kildare, to include the installation of a picnic table, park benches, plants and gravel paths. Funding will also support the purchase of new tools and a secondhand ride-on lawnmower to facilitate the ongoing maintenance of these areas. |
| Respond | Wicklow | The construction of a community hub in a new Respond housing estate in Rathcoran, Baltinglass, Co Wicklow. The space will be used for activities such as parent/toddler groups, arts and crafts classes, coffee mornings and tenant/support service meetings. The pavillion will also be home to Respond's Brain Health Initiative. |
| Galway Simon | Galway | The development of an outdoor community café space at a hub leased from Galway County Council. Funding will cover the cost of installing a retractable awning to weatherproof the space, seating and planters. The outdoor café service will be provided by 79G, a mobile coffee van operated by Galway Simon as a social enterprise. The community hub is currently used for weekly social integration activities and has an allotment to allow service users to grow their own produce. |
| Kildare County Council | Kildare | Equipment and wellbeing programmes for residents of Anne Street Estate in Kildare. Funding will cover the provision of outdoor leisure equipment and health and wellbeing programmes. Funding will also cover the costs of a community storage shed to be used by various groups and services. |
| Oaklee Housing | Laois, Kilkenny, Westmeath and Offaly | Environmental and biodiversity initiatives at four general need schemes in Laois, Kilkenny, Westmeath and Offaly. Projects to include features such as wildflower meadows, tree planting, bug hotels, hedgehog sanctuaries, community orchards and fruit & vegetable growing schemes. |
| Tuath Housing | Dublin | An activity camp at the Hampton Wood estate in Finglas, Dublin. The camp programme will provide a safe environment for tenants to develop social skills, decision-making skills and experience the great outdoors. Children's activities will focus on values such as self-identity, self-worth, self-esteem, leadership and self-respect. |
| Sophia Housing | Dublin | An upgrade of communal areas at Sophia's Tallaght and Donabate accommodation in Dublin. Funding will be used to replace the carpets in communal areas of six apartment blocks in Tallaght. At Donabate, funds will be used to upgrade the tarmac in the car park (€5,175) and to upgrade all external lighting to LED bulbs (€1,724). |
| Meath County Council | Meath | The provision of a 'Magic Table' and library materials at the Unity Centre, a community centre in Dunloe Park, Navan. The 'Magic Table' (Tovertagel) is a fun care innovation designed for use by people with autism, dementia and additional learning needs or a cognitive impairment. It consists of a series of interactive light games, projected onto a table, with infrared sensors to respond to hand and arm movements of the players. Funding will also cover costs of sensory and tactile books and toys. |
| Waterford City and County Council | Waterford | The fit-out of a community centre, which will be used as a horticultural educational training hub. The building is adjacent to a derelict community area that the council, in conjunction with Waterford Local Community Safety Partnership, is developing into a horticultural project. The horticultural site, which will include allotments, will provide a resource to community groups of all ages. The adjacent centre will be used to provide wellbeing courses, life skills training and workshops on healthy eating and meal preparation on a budget. |
| Tipperary County Council | Tipperary | The development of a range of art and play therapy programmes for children living in East Urban Tipperary Town. Programmes would focus on these issues, as well as self-esteem, communication skills and the value of education. The intention is to run eight programmes with different themes over a six-week period. |
| St John of God's | Wicklow | Outdoor recreational area at a community home for people with intellectual disabilities, located in Bray, Co Wicklow. The property will provide a home for four individuals who are moving from a congregated setting. HFA funding will go towards the cost of works to enhance the enclosed outdoor area with a decking area, a dedicated wildflower meadow and a grass path to allow for a continuous loop. |
