Awardee	Location	Project
FOLD Ireland	Dublin	Gardening projects in Wellview and Ballygall, incorporating vegetable patches, horticultural courses, flower arranging activities and a bee pollination project.
FOLD Ireland	Dublin	An exercise and activity programme for older residents, delivered by Siel Bleu, at the Cherryfields accommodation unit, which provides accommodation for dementia care.
Clann Housing	Kerry and Limerick	A video project, which will engage with older residents in Kerry and Limerick about a favourite photograph from their past.
Cooperative Housing Ireland	Dublin	The renovation and retrofit of a community building in the Fingal area. The space will be used for sports, dance programmes, arts and culture, martial arts classes, counselling services, job training and career advice.
The Iveagh Trust	Dublin	A purpose-built pavilion in Clongriffin to serve as a community facility for local residents. The space will be used for tenant committee meetings, youth diversion activities, educational opportunities and leisure activities.
Clúid Housing Association	Kerry	An Integration, Diversity and Community programme promoting positive engagement and social inclusion of ethnic communities in the Struthán na Sailí housing estate in Killarney.
Clúid Housing Association	Cork	The transformation of a greenspace at the Millbrook housing scheme, to include accessible adult gym equipment, a wildflower meadow and benches.
Westmeath County Council	Westmeath	The renovation of a community facility in Mullingar, which will serve in excess of 500 people in the surrounding area. A number of new social homes are to be delivered in the adjoining housing estate this year.
Focus Ireland	Dublin	The redevelopment of a public space at George's Hill supported housing complex, which provides long-term housing to people who previously experienced homelessness. The newly developed space will provide areas for community engagement, including chess tables and seating, as well as children's play areas and greenery to enhance the communal space.
HAIL	Dublin	A tenant forum gardening group in co-operation with St John of God's Housing in Tallaght. The project will offer gardening skills classes to residents and the commencement of a planting programme at the St John of God's site. Flowers from the site will be used in hanging baskets to be distributed to local housing estates.
Oaklee Housing	Dublin, Offaly, Wexford	Community-building activities at six housing schemes, to include family fun days, community gardening, arts and crafts workshops and festive-themed events.
Joint: Clúid, Circle & Respond	Nationwide	A telephone survey of 300 residents of diverse ethnic/migrant backgrounds as part of the Quality in Our Diversity project. The joint project is aimed at developing a process through which social housing providers can apply for accreditation as a positive and supportive landlord for those from diverse ethnic and/or migrant backgrounds.
Circle VHA	Dublin	Social engagement activities for tenants at Tallaght's Deerpark housing estate, focusing on tenants from groups that are recognised as being most at risk of social isolation. Activities will include arts and crafts, gardening, healthy eating, yoga, mindfulness, music, drama and information sessions on topics such as budgeting and parenting.
Tuath Housing	Dublin	Personal development programmes that utilise hairdressing and barbering to stimulate creativity while creating a positive outlet for young people. The project will target young people at risk of leaving school early and/or becoming involved in drugs and crime in North Dublin.

Tuath Housing	Cork	A summer youth camp at The Meadows housing estate in Co Cork. The camp will be aimed at people aged 10-15 years old, providing activities that encourage social skills, community engagement, healthy eating, biodiversity, creativity and involvement in sports.
Foscadh Housing	Tipperary	A sensory garden at Henry Laffan Heights housing estate, incorporating features such as restful seating areas, aromatic plants, vivid colours and flora that attract wildlife.
Clanmil Housing Association	Louth	A sensory garden in Claddagh Park community, featuring sensory plants and signage and material to stimulate the senses. The garden will be developed adjacent to an existing creche.
